PRESERVING TRADITION:

The History and Legacy of SDHS Colors

School colors are a cornerstone of identity, embodying an institution's pride, history, and values. For **SDHS**, the traditional colors of **Blue**, **White**, and **Gray** have long been symbols of its rich heritage and enduring legacy. In 2023, however, the current administration introduced **Black** into the color scheme, which was introduced by an athletic director back in 2013-14 in a branding book. That athletic director never attended SDHS and had no stake in the history of SDHS also bypassed key stakeholders in the decision to include Black, which has sparked debate about the importance of honoring tradition. This article explores the origins and significance of SDHS's traditional colors and why preserving them is essential to maintaining the unity and history of SDHS.

The Origins of Blue and White

From its earliest days, SDHS adopted **Blue** and **White** as its school colors, a choice imbued with symbolism. **Blue**, often associated with loyalty, wisdom, and inspiration, reflects the school's commitment to academic excellence and fostering strong community ties. **White**, representing integrity and hope, reinforces the school's dedication to ethical leadership and the belief in the potential of every student.

Together, blue and white became the visual identity of SDHS, evoking a sense of pride among students, staff, and alumni and connecting generations through a shared tradition.

The Addition of Gray: A Tribute to the Old Gray Castle

The introduction of **Gray** to the SDHS color palette was a deliberate decision to honor the **Old Gray Castle**, one of the school's most cherished landmarks. This historic building, constructed in the early 19th century, symbolizes strength, resilience, and legacy for the SDHS community. The gray stone walls of the **Old Gray Castle** are more than an architectural feature—they are a testament to the school's endurance and the countless milestones it has witnessed. Incorporating **Gray** into the school colors ensured the castle's legacy would be forever intertwined with the identity of SDHS, a move celebrated by alumni.

The Controversial Introduction of Black

Many in the SDHS community felt the addition of black diluted the school's historical identity and

overshadowed the significance of the original colors. In 2008, football Coach Paul Turner ordered Black uniforms for the football team against the advice not to. The team wore the uniforms, and Coach Turner was fired. The lack of consultation with those deeply connected to SDHS's traditions heightened concerns that the decision prioritized aesthetics over legacy. During the football playoff game between SDHS and St. Augustine HS on November 22, 2024, SDHS coaches wore all black rather than any traditional school colors of Blue, White, or Gray. On February 21, 2025, the Cavers boys varsity basketball team played Sage Creek High School (SC) in the playoff. Saga Creek wore their school colors, Black





and White. There was a large crowd, but the only problem was that you could not tell the Caver fans from the Saga Creek fans because the Caver fans were also wearing Black.

One of the missions of the SDHS Alumni Association is to keep the history and school colors as part of its history and traditions.

Why Tradition Matters

Blue, White, and now Gray are more than

aesthetic choices—they represent the heart

of SDHS's identity. These colors honor the school's mission, values, and history while fostering unity among its community.

Blue, **White**, **and Gray** connect current students to generations of alumni, serving as a bridge between past and present. They visually and symbolically tie SDHS to the enduring presence of the **Old Gray Castle**, a cornerstone of the school's heritage. Preserving these colors reinforces a sense of continuity and pride, ensuring that the SDHS identity remains intact for future generations.

A Call to Action

To respect and uphold SDHS's legacy, staff, coaches, and teams representing the school at events should prioritize the traditional colors of Blue, White, and Gray. By doing so, they honor the history and traditions that have helped shape SDHS into the institution it is today. The values, traditions, and symbols have defined SDHS's character over 142 years. The decision to embrace tradition at public events and competitions will foster solidarity and pride among the SDHS community, showing reverence for the long and distinguished history of SDHS. Let your voices be heard and defend the school tradition and colors of Blue, White, and Gray, NOT Black.

Conclusion

The history of SDHS's colors is a story of tradition, resilience, and identity. Blue, White, and Gray must remain at the forefront of the school's representation. These colors are more than a design choice—they are the visual legacy of SDHS, Honoring the Old Gray Castle and the generations of students, staff, and alumni who have worn the colors and called SDHS home. By embracing its traditional colors, SDHS ensures its history is celebrated, its values are upheld, and its legacy endures for another 99 years.

Great things have been happening in our Archives & History Center! We applied for a small grant with California Revealed, "Cataloging California" Description Assistance Award. Great News, is that we secured the reimbursement grant. This will fund about 54 hours of cataloging a portion of our collections. We are currently cataloging 700 Russ newspapers, 50 AV (Audio-Visual) items, and yearbooks going back to 1900. Once we have our items cataloged, we will be applying for the Digitization Grant with California Revealed. Hopefully our items will be nominated. This will enable us to digitize our cataloged items and make them available online.

I have a great team of student archivists. Josie Zubkoff is the President of the SDHS Archive Club. She came to me last year and this group of students have been the spark needed to get this project going. Here is a message from President Josie:

We are the San Diego High School Archives Club, a group of current SDH students who meet on Mondays to explore the SDHS Alumni Association Archives. Our goal is to preserve our school's rich history and remove barriers between it and the community. The club was founded back in 2022, when students realized that there was no student organization that enabled students to explore SDHS's 140+ year history. Excited to finally see the elusive archives, the founding members began working with Ms. Yvette, the Alumni Association Historian. As we explored and met with Ms. Yvette and other historians, we realized how much work there was to be done to preserve its contents.

During our meetings, we work in the Archives organizing countless objects—photographs, yearbooks, Russ copies, school assignments, student writings—into boxes and digital catalogs. Our hope in organizing and digitizing these artifacts is to make the archives, and the school history captured within them, more accessible to our community. In pursuit of that goal, we publish our favorite artifacts to our Instagram in a "Find of the Week" series, as well as present physical copies of them to current students at club fairs. Another project we are working on is collecting school history through interviews with alumni. These interviews enable us to capture former Cavers' unique memories of their time at school. This has afforded us the opportunity to form connections with alumni. We have interviewed over a dozen Caver alumni, and we hope to hear from many of you.
